

Hey Mr. DJ

No great party is complete without good music. Make your next event anything but ordinary by hiring a professional [New York City DJ](#). You are sure to get your guests grooving, swaying and moving to the beat when you [book a New York City DJ](#) to spin on the turntable.

Below are good points to consider when hiring any disc jockey from the talented pool of [New York City DJs](#):

- They say experience is the best teacher so it follows that a tenured DJ would be your best bet for your next big event. Know what particular occasions your choice disc jockey specializes in. It's important to know what type of music the DJ can perform and the equipment and skills he or she has are appropriate for your event. The last thing you'd want to have at your wedding is a turntable spinner who has experience in Sweet Sixteen parties and that alone.
- DJs are typically trained for at least a year – inclusive of on-the-job training – before go on out on their own to play at different gigs. As in any profession, the longer the DJ is in his or her particular line of work, the more skilled he or she must be. No offense to those who are only starting out in the business but you might want to rest it out first during grand affairs.
- It's been said time and time again that it's not all about the looks but also the personality. This holds true in finding a DJ who would provide much needed music in your party. Dance parties, homecoming balls and coming-of-age parties may require an energetic DJ oozing with personality, so to speak. But as for more intimate affairs such as weddings, anniversaries and corporate gatherings – low-key affairs – an up and about DJ-about-town is not the best choice.
- A commendable DJs music library should carry most, if not genres of music. Consult your DJ of choice prior to the event and check whether personal requests from guests could be honored considering his or her existing song lineup. Apart from having a vast music library, a good DJ should have the latest top of the line equipment as well as back up systems.
- Ask for references when hiring a DJ. You might find [cheap Long Island DJs](#) or [cheap New York City DJs](#) but chances are they have been nothing but noisy nuances at previous gigs they have worked on. Most DJs have testimonial letters from clients and its best if you go over such.
