

Hiring A Wedding DJ

- You know what they say about early birds. Think of what music you'd like to sing and dance to on your wedding day and book the right DJ for your party at least six months before you tie the knot.
- Don't let the DJ or the band turn your wedding into a practicing area – get someone who is experienced in the craft lest you want no one on the dance floor.
- Referrals aren't just useful in job seeking but also finding the right person in charge of your wedding music. Ask friends and family if they can recommend any singer, band or DJ.
- Know early on how much the service will cost. Musicians and DJs charge per hour and their rates may vary per season or per day even – non-peak seasons and weekday nights tend to be cheaper.
- Ask for samples of work in DVD or MP3 form just so you have an idea of how your choice musician sounds like. To hear is to believe, let's put it that way.
- Create different play lists for the different highlights of your big day – from the first dance down to the cake cutting. Be sure to discuss the selection with your DJ or band and don't hesitate to make requests.
