

## Your Basic TV Problems Solved

If it still won't work, try turning on the set using the power button found on the set itself. If your TV comes to life, all you need to do is change your remote's batteries and reset. Can't see any picture at all? Check the back of your TV to see if all basic wires are properly connected. If everything's hooked up and there's still no picture, it's best to phone your cable or satellite provider and give them all the details of your problem.
